





EXPLORE HISTORIC

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Battery point is a charming, historic village to discover on foot. Window shopping can be a delightful way to pass the day, with plenty of antique shops, boutiques and bookstores to explore.

On or near Hampden Road, a handful of restaurants, cafés, and bakeries, offer coffee, tea and fresh, Tasmanian food to enjoy. There are treats here for every craving. Grab a tasty snack and have a look around.

St. George's Anglican Church appeals to those intrigued by dramatic architecture. The church was designed by John Lee Archer in 1838. It sits upon Battery Point's highest spot, making it visible from the Derwent River, where colonial sailors could see the bright, whale oil lamp, burning in the tower and would use it to guide them home.



In the centre village green, 'Arthur Circus' awaits you. Original cottages wrap around a quaint, circular park, for a step back in time. Mostly built in the 1840s/ 50s, in the early days of old Hobart Town, these quirky little cottages have since been restored and are now highly prized residences.

CSIRO in Battery Point

CSIRO is Australia's national science agency and focuses on marine and atmospheric research at this site in front of Princes Park, Battery Point. The site includes several national research collections, including collections of algae and fish species, and is the home of the Marine National Facility and research vessel (RV) Investigator.



A public walkway runs around the front of the main CSIRO building, providing access to a viewing platform above the working wharf. This offers an excellent vantage point for a close-up view of RV Investigator when it's in port.

BATTERY POINT



Explore Princes Park. There's a playground for the kids, an historic landmark, and ample grass for a picnic or a lie down. See page 22.

- **STOP E** Battery Point: Take an easy walk through the heart of historic Battery Point. Quaint cafés and shops await in this unforgettable little colonial village. See page 23.
- **STOP (F)** St. Georges Church: Marvel at this beautiful colonial church, a true architectural gem. See page 25.
- **STOP** G St. Georges Terrace: Great photo op with stunning views. A short walk through the charming streets of Battery Point takes you to the beautiful suburb of Sandy Bay. See page 25.



- Head to the Hobart Signal Station at Princes Park - the oldest building in Battery Point, built as part of a series of semaphore stations!
- Explore the Batteries, decommissioned in 1878, and imagine what it was like to defend the harbour in the early 19th century.
- Take the kids to the pirate ship playground - Arrr, matey!
- Take a walk on the artsy side and follow the Battery Point Sculpture Trail along the waterfront, an entertaiing and inspiring way to discover the area's unique history through a collection of quirky sculptures.





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- Stroll down Hampden Road! This historic street is home to charming Georgian cottages, many of which have been transformed into hip cafés, delicious restaurants, and stylish boutiques.
- Follow in Bobby's footsteps on a self-guided history walk! A great way to discover the area's rich history and fascinating stories. Visit

- Make sure to visit the iconic Arthur Circus! This quaint street is lined with charming old cottages and boasts a lovely village green.
- Get a glimpse into Hobart's past: take Kelly St via Hampden Rd to the historic Kelly's Steps. These sandstone colonial steps lead you down into Salamanca Place.

NARRYNA, 1840, is a merchant's town house reflecting the trade and maritime histories of Salamanca Place and Battery Point. This architectural gem presents a rich picture of Tasmanian colonial life.

SANDY BAY WATERFRONT WALK



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After a spot of boutique shopping in Sandy Bay ("Stop I"), grab a coffee and a snack for the road! Stroll past the cottage houses on King Street and follow Marieville Esplanade along the waterfront. Dip your toes into the cool water at Short Beach and continue your walk past the sailing boats and around to Wrest Point Casino ("Stop H").

Look out for the Errol Flynn Monument at the far end of Short Beach and the prized Sydney to Hobart Yacht Race Trophy at The Royal Yacht Club of Tasmania.

GETTING YOUR BEARINGS

HOBART CITY CENTRE

Hobart is Australia's second oldest capital city after Sydney in New South Wales. It is a small city with low-rise buildings connected by one-way streets and surrounded by plenty of green space. Hobart lies on the edge of the River Derwent with an ever changing backdrop of kunanyi/Mt Wellington. Over 200,000 people live in the Greater Hobart area and over 500,000 in Tasmania. The Queens Domain contains the Roval Tasmanian Botanical Gardens, please see page 48 for more information.

BATTERY POINT

Hobart's oldest and most historic suburb, named after the battery of guns established on the point in 1818 as part of Hobart's coastal defences. Houses in Battery Point were built in the 1830s - 40s to accommodate the growing settlement, ranging from small fisherman's cottages to mansions of merchants and master mariners. Today, Battery Point is one of the city's most prestigious suburbs.

SANDY BAY

Located south of Hobart, stretching between Mt Nelson and the beaches along the River Derwent. Sandy Bay is a popular and diverse suburb with colonial sandstone buildings, large modern homes and student accommodation surrounding the University of Tasmania.





Beneath the shadow of kunanyi/Mount Wellington, the UNESCO World Heritage-listed Cascades Female Factory is the best place to connect with the lesser known stories of Australia's female convicts.

From 1828–1853 thousands of women and children were imprisoned here; many never left.

Joining a guided tour brings the stories of this challenging but very special place to life. Tours reveal stories of the women and the punishment system to which they endured and railed against. Ticket proceeds help to fund the ongoing conservation of the site.



HOBART RIVULET WALK


The Hobart Rivulet Walking Track (below): approximately 40-minute or 2.7km, this pleasant urban bush walk gives the visitor a bit of a Hobart colonial history lesson along the way.

Follow the Hobart Rivulet Walking Track downstream from the foothills of kunanyi / Mount Wellington, beginning at either "Stop J" - near the historic Cascade Brewery (across the road, in Cascade Gardens lush park ground) or "Stop K" near the World Heritage Listed Cascades Female Factory.

This well-marked track has a gentle downhill grade, guiding you back into the city to meet up with us at Stop "M" on Collins Street (page 39) to resume your Hop-on Hop-off city loop tour.

Keep your eye on the water or water's edge for the platypus that call the Hobart Rivulet home. These incredibly special animals, living so close to Hobart City, have recently become stars in a documentary called "The Platypus Guardian". Platypus are shy, endangered and nocturnal. The possibility is very slim that you will see one in the daylight. Please always be respectful of their habitat. The city of Hobart's Bushcare Program aims to raise awareness of the significant need for the protection of this unique species. Thank you from the people of Hobart and all platypus lovers.
